■ for your academic research project

- Each year PMI supports research projects from around the globe that advance the project management body of knowledge and/or its application. PMI encourages proposals for research involving multi-disciplinary teams of scholars or teams consisting of scholars and practitioners.
- **Call for research proposals opens annually 1 February and closes 25 April.**
- Annual grant recipients are announced in January.

■ for your doctoral research project

- PMI Educational Foundation Doctoral Research Grant Program supports doctoral research in project, program, and/or portfolio management.
- PMI Academic Resources reviews, evaluates and recommends proposals for funding.
- Applications are accepted from part-time and full-time doctoral students at accredited colleges and universities.
- Two calls for proposals are issued each year. Visit www.pmief.org for details.
